Where has this year gone?

It's hard to believe that April is here, and our year is ending. But it's been an outstanding year, and I thank all of you for your participation and hard work. We have 21 new members, and they have become enthusiastic, active members.

Our programs this year, have been outstanding! We've enjoyed literature, art, music, history, community and civic affairs, museum trips, calligraphy, ballroom dancing and we still have Bingo on April 5th. Our lite lunches and

catered lunches were all wonderful. We have one more opportunity to bring a favorite recipe to share with the membership with our lite lunch on April 19th.

This year has seen our most successful fundraising for the Woman's Club. From our rummage sale, bake sales, 50/50 drawing, Woman's Show and shopping partnerships with Winter Park stores, we have raised over \$11,000. Part of these funds will be distributed soon to local charities while the rest will be deposited in an account for future use. This year we have also been involved with more charitable activities in the community – particularly with the Orlando Union Rescue Mission (Thanksgiving dinner, Christmas dinner and gift wrapping, purple bags and sneakers) and Welbourne Day Nursery. Thank you to all of you: Committee chairs, speakers and especially our 2017-2018 board members and our general membership. The members of the Woman's Club are truly a talented group of women and very generous of giving so many hours of service to better so many lives. And in the process, become very good friends with one another.

I would like to inform our membership of two other areas of possible service to our community. From our self-defense class, we learned about the Victim's Service Center and how they need to provide new clothes to sexually abused victims. The center has informed me that last year 4,569 victims in Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties were either victims of physical or sexual assault.

One in three women has been the victim of some sort of physical violence, and one in six women has been the victim of an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime. April is sexual awareness month and would be the perfect time to sponsor a clothing drive to benefit these victims. All items collected must be new with the tags still on them. Every victim receives all new clothing and shoes to provide as much comfort as possible. Items needed: leggings, t-shirts, flip-flops, and sports bras. These items range from XS-XL, and they are always in need of all sizes. You may bring your donated items to the club anytime during the month of April. There is also a group foster home located in Winter Park that houses 15 young adults (18-23) who have been homeless or in foster homes. At this time, they are looking for volunteers to provide a meal (either home-cooked or purchased) on one Sunday each month.

iPrevail International Foundation, an all-volunteer nonprofit organization, is working with seven of these homes in Central Florida and would like the Woman's Club to partner with them in providing assistance to the Winter Park home. There is also the possibility of providing welcome baskets to new residents or helping with a birthday party. If you are interested in this project contact Aycha or me.
