

Harry Rinker Stamps and The Making of a Stamp



MEET: Harry Rinker

Harry Rinker is a national antiques and collectibles authority, author, columnist, educator, lecturer, curmudgeon, private collector, and dedicated accumulator. Rinker owns Harry L. Rinker, LLC, dba as Rinker Consulting, a firm specializing in providing appraisal, editorial, educational, media, personal appearance, research, and writing services in the antiques and collectibles field.

"Rinker on Collectibles," his weekly syndicated column, ended on its 35th anniversary in December 2021. A total of 1,820 columns were written. "Rinker on Collectibles", appeared in trade papers, periodicals, and websites. For 11 1/2 years, Rinker hosted "Whatcha Got?" a syndicated, two-hour antiques and collectibles call-in radio show aired by Genesis Communications. He still does a special once-a-month "Whatcha Got?" for WRTA in Altoona, PA.

Rinker has consulted and written for WorthPoint.com since its inception. He wrote the category taxonomies for the website.

Rinker has authored over 20 books about antiques and collectibles, many of which appeared in multiple editions. His total book count is over 50. Rinker starred in 78 half- hour episodes of the television show "Collector Inspector" that aired on Home & Eamp; Garden Television (HGTV) from 2002 to 2004. Rinker serves on the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee, a 15-member committee that provides recommendations on the subject matter and design of stamps to the Postmaster General. He will complete his fourth and final three-year term in October 2023.

Rinker has appeared as a guest on over 500 radio and television shows including The Today Show, Oprah, and Martha Stewart.

Rinker has two terminal degrees – an MFA in creative and professional writing and a PhD in American Decorative Arts with concentrations in the History of Science and History of Technology, Rinker is the Genealogist and Registrar for the West Michigan Chapter, Michigan State Society (MISSAR), and the Central Florida Chapter, Florida State Society (FLSSAR) of the Sons of the American Revolution. He serves on the FLSSAR and MISSAR Genealogical Committee.

We simply couldn't have accomplished any of that without the support of Audubon Park and my parents who always have shown me that through hard work many obstacles can be overcome. We hope to continue to be consistent as I believe that is an underrated task day in and day out in the restaurant industry. We do not compromise on the quality of ingredients we use as well.

Currently, we are on our 11th menu since opening in 2010 as we strive to trim the "fat" and add new dishes. Some of our latest dishes are the Red Light Roll, the Tuna Crunch and the Sora Roll.
