

After college and graduate school, she became a high school English teacher in the Bronx, then moved to Florida, where she worked as a counselor, which became her second career. When she married Jerry Schiffhorst, an English professor at UCF, she went back to teaching, this time on the college level. Now that she's retired as a counselor and a teacher, she's back to reading poetry,

American and European.

Lynn is a member of the Florida State Poets Association, which sponsors a group that meets monthly at the Maitland Public Library in person or on Zoom.
