

Historian

Did You Know?

On July 29, 1937, Mrs. Mary Lee DePugh founded The Ideal Woman's Club of Winter Park, an organization comprised of "ambitious community women" dedicated to reviving both the spirit and pride of the African American community and of the Black clubwoman. Mrs. DePugh, a domestic in the employ of Mrs. Maud Kraft, an active member of The Woman's Club of Winter Park and in Evanston, Illinois, established The Ideal Woman's Club in Hannibal Square in the Westside of Winter Park as an organization that would integrate Christian ideals with social and community service activities. When Mary Lee arrived in West Winter Park from Evanston, Illinois, she quickly saw the need to create a community space where women could join together to address the needs in the community and enjoy social club activities and comradery.



A resolution that originally hung in the foyer of The Woman's Club of Winter Park's historic clubhouse, but now safely stored in an archival box in the Club's Archives, commemorates the role played by The Woman's Club of Winter Park in the formation of The Ideal Woman's Club. Maud, as both a fellow clubwoman and Mary Lee's friend, played a crucial role in helping Mary Lee fulfill her vision. When Maud learned of The Congregational Church's intent to remove the old Hooker Memorial House



from church property, she approached church leaders about the possibility of purchasing the building and moving it to the Westside for the use of The Ideal Woman's Club. At a meeting on December 13, 1939, the church donated the building in exchange for Maud financing the move. She generously paid the five hundred dollars expense and, until the completion of their new clubhouse in 1997, The Ideal Woman's Club continued to use the historic building as its clubhouse. In a Woman's Club of Winter Park scrapbook dated 1938 – 1943, a letter printed in the local newspaper expresses appreciation for "the giving and moving of the Hooker Memorial Building" and to "the Woman's Club for the donation of chairs and other necessary articles."

For decades, American clubwomen, in Winter Park and across the country, have often pursued their goals in a parallel, largely segregated manner. Upon occasion, some progressive clubwomen have looked beyond the color of their skin and sought personal and societal enhancement through interracial alliances.

In recognition of Women's History Month, on Wednesday, March 26, at 4:00 pm, historians Kim Mould and Fairolyn Livingston will be speaking at The Rollins College Olin Library about these two remarkable Winter Park clubwomen and their respective clubs. To learn more about Mrs. Kraft and Mrs. DePugh and the compelling, often complex relationships between White employers and their African American domestics, please read Mrs. Maud Kraft and Mrs. Mary Lee DePugh – Winter Park Clubwomen researched and written by Kim Mould, the 2001 recipient of The Rhea Marsh and Dorothy Lockhart Smith Winter Park History Research Grant sponsored by The Winter Park Public Library and The Rollins College Olin Library.

The fascinating video

shared historic photographs from our 110 year history, but also highlighted many of our significant successes in the last 10 years. The video also included plans for near future clubhouse preservation needs and wishes, and the importance of continuing to support our Preservation Fund. An insert placed in the attractive program (special thanks to **Kathy Parham** and **Roy Clement**) and provided at each table setting noted these specific preservation projects. A special shout-out to **Lucy McDonough** who worked so incredibly hard despite her fresh skiing injury!





Orlando Rabbit Care and Adoptions, Inc. (ORCA) is an animal welfare corporation focused on rescue of domestic rabbits and raising awareness of the need for helping these animals – the third-most found animal in shelters. Originally formed as a social and educational entity, ORCA began rescue operations in 2016 and is one of the larger rabbit-focused rescues in the state of Florida. Locally, they partner with other animal rescue organizations, most of which do not serve the rabbit community. Being 100% foster-based, volunteers are key to their success.

Representing ORCA will be Alicia Koch and Kathy Harter. They will provide some background on the needs of domestic rabbits and address the comment that everyone has – "a rabbit rescue? I didn't know there was such a thing!" And yes, there will be bunnies!!!

MEET: **Alicia Koch**. Alicia began volunteering with ORCA in May 2020 after spending 15 days catching a loose rabbit in St. Cloud. She currently serves on the Board of Directors as Foster & Adoption Coordinator and Social Media Coordinator. Prior to moving to Florida, she volunteered at Great Lakes Rabbit Sanctuary in Michigan. She shares her home with her husband,



Sweetie (10-years old from Great Lakes Rabbit Sanctuary), Wallee (5 years old, ORCA rescue), Clover the cat (Candy's Cats rescue).

MEET: **Kathy Harter**. Kathy joined ORCA as a volunteer in 2006 when she began performing accounting duties. Her initial efforts included getting ORCA designated as aa 501(c)3 non-profit. In the past she has held several Board of Directors positions – President, Vice President and Treasurer. Current volunteer efforts are focused on educating government officials on the need to protect domestic rabbits. Kathy lives in Oviedo with her husband, Chippy (6 years old, ORCA rescue) and Paul the Cat – a former stray who has joined the family.
